HEALTHCARE FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS

Foreign students, whose citizenship is from any of the following countries, are automatically enrolled into the Italian Health Care System (S.S.N.):

- EU citizens and citizens of NORWAY, ICELAND, LICHTENSTEIN and SWITZERLAND temporarily residing in Italy
- Citizens of ARGENTINA, AUSTRALIA, BOSNIA-ERZEGOVINA, CAPO VERDE, THE VATICAN, MACEDONIA, MONTENEGRO, MONACO, REPUBLIC OF SAN MARINO, SERBIA, TUNISIA ---- countries which have a bilateral agreement for temporary residence in Italy
- NON-EU citizens with legally residing in Italy

If you are a foreign student NOT belonging to the above list of countries, with a legal residence (*permesso di soggiorno*), MAKE SURE THAT YOU ENROLL/ENSURE IN THE ITALIAN HEALTHCARE SYSTEM (S.S.N.) through a yearly, renewable fee. Generally, the *permesso di soggiorno* must be valid at least 3 months in order to obtain healthcare insurance. However, there is an exception for students: they can enroll in the ITALIAN HEALTH CARE SYSTEM (S.S.N.) with a shorter *permesso di soggiorno*.

The yearly healthcare fee is 149, 75 Euro, for students with no other income except scholarships or other contributions issued by Italian public institutions.

<u>TO ENROLL</u>: Go to the A.S.L. (local health care office) where you live. Once enrolled, your ticket fee for medical assistance will be the same as that of Italian citizens.
